




15 steps visit to Kettering General Hospital

And what would happen on the day and what the volunteers would do



5 young people went to Kettering General Hospital for the visit






They walked around and gave feedback about the children's areas in the hospital

They visited the Skylark Children's Ward

The Emergency department




The staff were kind, caring and very friendly




To get to the waiting room you go to reception first



Then they unlock the door for you after you are checked in








The locked doors only allowed staff members to unlock them with a key

When you go through the door there are fish on the floor

To show you how to get to the waiting room









The wating room was calm and quiet


And warm

The walls were decorated with cartoon sea life.

Skirting boards were falling off.



There are toys



And activities on the walls like 'count the fish'





And handheld games you can borrow.

A poster with your journey through the hospital processes is on display




A notice board displayed information but did not match the heading – **Exciting news ahead!**

In the waiting room you can rent a power bank to charge your phone

There is a water station available

They also offer free Wi-Fi but there was no poster displaying this





They are decorating rooms one by one

Ultraviolet light is in the plaster room to clean the room and to get rid of germs

> When leaving the emergency department there are no signs to guide you to Skylark ward

We asked a hospital volunteer how to get there









Then there were signs to get to the Skylark ward

Staff told us that if the patient is aged 16-18



It will be up to the patient if they go to the children's department



Or to the adult's department



All staff wore masks

Skylark Ward



It was welcoming as soon as you enter



There were neutral colours throughout the halls



And decorations of birds and trees on the walls







Because there was lots of light




Allowing the nature outside to be seen from inside




There is a sensory room

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The Play Therapist talked us through the different ways to help the children get ready for their treatment



Whether it is for surgery or for an MRI







Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)

Also known as an MRI it is a scan of the body done using magnets to get pictures of the body from the inside



Or for a blood test







The waiting room could become cramped if there were too many patients

The toys available are all aimed at younger kids, nothing for the older ones

There were QR codes for patients to give their ideas for improvement across both wards




There was a sign for a 7-day parking permit if they were staying longer than 24 hours



The staff are putting together a 'hospital passport' for those who come to the ward a lot

The young people made 8 recommendations – these were to:



 Fix the broken skirting board in the waiting room of A&E or to cover it to make sure that no one gets hurt







- 2.Change the way the noticeboard is displayed in the Emergency Department
- 3.Add a sign displaying there is free Wi-Fi available
- 4.Add a sign outside accident and emergency with directions
- 5.Add entertainment for teenagers to the Skylark waiting room



- 6.Add 'Are you a young carer?' to the check-in form
- 7.Add some colours to the flooring of the hallway as you enter the Skylark Ward

8.Display that other drinks can be requested by the drink dispenser

The report was rewarding and enjoyable




We have already made some changes

To see the sensory room






